Welcome to Deal Town Council's 2021/22 Annual Report

Message from the Worshipful Mayor of Deal Cllr Chris Turner

In May 2021, the Council's AGM was an online event. Although the virus has not gone away, the worst of the pandemic is behind us – for the moment. Constant vigilance is the order of the day, but much of town life has returned to how it was before.

Much of the core work of the Council has survived, but some timelines for Implementation of particular projects and initiatives have had to be extended.

The reports received at the Annual Town Meeting on 26 April 2022 provided a useful record of what has been achieved.

Markets: Closing the town's markets during lockdowns caused a storm of protest. Government guidelines were being observed, and all decisions about markets were subject to scrutiny by the full council.

Now it is a completely different picture! The Saturday Market goes from strength to strength. The new gazebos are a very welcome development. In addition, the Town Hall Undercroft is coming back into use for stall-holders very soon.

The closure of part of the High Street between 10am and 2pm has contributed much to the buzz that is Saturday morning in Deal.

Town Plan: One of the big projects the Council agreed back in 2019 was the development of a Town Plan. Again, we have to say that the pandemic caused our plans to be temporarily stalled, but I am delighted to say that the Town Plan is approaching the final stages of its development.

What will emerge will be the result of wide and persistent engagement with the people of Deal. It will reflect their priorities for actions and for lobbying (where the Town Council does not have the powers or the facilities to implement).

The Climate Emergency: Back in June 2019, Deal Town Council declared a climate emergency. Since then, there has been steady progress towards reducing the council's carbon footprint. At the Annual Town Meeting, Matthew Morris from STEM Sustainability reported on the progress Deal Town Council has made. He was very complementary, stating that we are among a small number of councils that have achieved so much towards a very ambitious target.

There is more that still needs to be done, but the direction of travel is most encouraging, and all the better to hear that from an external consultant.

The Town Mayor has been busy during the last twelve months. I have attended a wide range of events, and represented Deal at a good number of civic and fund-raising occasions in East Kent.

I have also enjoyed giving recognition (and sometimes publicity) to some of the unsung heroes and heroines of this town. Those people and their organisations are what make this town a very special place.

Conclusion

This council has one more year to run – there will be elections in May 2023. My hope is that we can enter those elections with our collective head held high, able to demonstrate that we have done our best for the town and people of Deal

Environment

Aim: Deal Town Council recognises that we face an unprecedented climate and environmental emergency and have committed to becoming a net zero carbon emitter in our own operations by 2025. We will use our power and influence to protect and improve the environment and encourage and support others to do the same, in addition to fulfilling our statutory environmental responsibilities and complying with all legal and other requirements. We are committed to transforming Deal into a cleaner, greener and healthier and more active town.

Finance and General Purposes

Aim: To ensure that the Town Council has and maintains an effective and efficient financial system with appropriate checks and controls. To develop and propose to the council the annual budget, monitor the council's Income and Expenditure statements.

Grant Sub-Committee

Aim: To review all applications received for a Special Project Grant, Community Contributions Grant and Annual Grant.

Planning

Aim: To make representations to the Local Planning authority on planning applications for Deal

Transport & Infrastructure

Aim: To enable wherever practicable the environment and transport infrastructure and services of the town to meet the needs of its citizens.



Headlines from the Council Committees

Environment Committee

Current Environment Committee projects for 2021—2022;

- To install the overall winning entry poster of the 'No Idling' campaign at pollution hotspots around the town
- To continue with i-Tree mapping to assess the current tree coverage across the Deal Urban area
- To monitor air quality near schools during peak times
- To ensure the council planters are sustainably planted
- To add two additional planters or ground planting in the Mill Hill area
- To plan for priority areas 5 and 6 of the Carbon Reduction Strategy and action plan

Finance & General Purposes Committee

In addition to approving the regular financial reports the Finance & General Purposes Committee approved over £14,000 of Grant funding.

The Finance & General Purposes Committee approved Annual Accounts.

The Council received a Clear audit report from the Council's internal and external auditors.

Projects for 2021-2022 are:

- Mayor's Parlour refurbishment
- Repairs to the Town Hall chamber windows and roof
- Moving from spreadsheet accounting to the Rialtas accounting package.
- Move to 'green gas' and 'green electricity'
- Continue to work with DDC to improve the Deal Public Toilets
- To continue with producing the Town Plan

Grants Sub Committee

As most local voluntary organisations were still unable to operate throughout the whole grant year, applications were again reduced in number.

A total of 13 applications were considered and recommendations for grant payments made to the Finance & General Purposes Committee.

Planning Committee

The Planning Committee is a statutory consultant for Dover District Council on planning applications for the three wards in Deal.

This committee makes the decision on the recommendations from Deal Town Council for these applications and consideration is always given to the environmental impact of materials proposed, the aesthetic aspects of applications in the conservation areas. These recommendations are then submitted to Dover District Council who are the planning authority for this area.

From May 2021 to April 2022 the Planning Committee has made recommendations on 199 Planning applications, 7 Tree applications and 3 Premises licence applications.

Dover District Council make the final decision on whether to grant planning permission.

Transport & Infrastructure Committee

Current Transport & Infrastructure Committee projects for 2021-22

- To ensure that the town council fingerposts are updated and refurbished
- To continue with the work creating a Highways Improvement Plan
- To continue work in improving accessibility routes in the town
- To pedestrianise the high street from Stanhope Road to Union Road on Saturdays
- Cycle Friendly Deal Phase 2
- Contribute to the Dover District Local Plan



All committee meetings take place in the Town Hall Chamber, and all are open to the public, except the Grants sub-committee.




