Welcome to the Annual Report for 2022/2023 which reflects the activities and services delivered by this Council during the last year.

This report will be available to download from our website <u>www.deal.gov.uk</u> which is regularly updated with details of Council meetings, events and local information.

In addition to the website, Council information is displayed on our notice board outside Deal Library, in the Undercroft and on the windows of the Town Hall. We also update the community notice board in the precinct weekly.

A town council is the first tier of local government and is a statutory body. There are fifteen Deal Town Council Councillors. They are elected for four years. At the Annual Meeting of the Town Council in May the members of the Council elect a Mayor/Chairperson of the Council and deputy to serve for the following twelve months.

There were nine scheduled meetings of Council during the past twelve months. In addition, the council has four statutory committees which hold regular meetings during the year. These committees are:

- Environment Committee
- Planning Committee
- Transport and Infrastructure Committee
- Finance and General Purposes Committee

All Council and Committee meetings are held in the Town Hall starting at 7.15pm and members of the public are welcome to attend. 15 minutes are set aside at each of these meetings to allow members of the public to speak on matters relating to agenda items before they are debated by Councillors.

### Message from the Chairperson of the Council and Worshipful Mayor of Deal Cllr Chris Turner

This has been another busy year for Deal Town Council. The knowledge that local elections take place in May 2023 adds a further urgency for plans to be finalised, election commitments fulfilled, and promises kept.

Above all else, however, it was good to operate in what passes for normality after the rigors of the pandemic.

**Town Plan** To aim to achieve a Town Plan was a big idea in 2019. The pandemic curtailed our ability to fully engage with disparate groups of people in Deal, but the impetus was maintained.

In the end, though, it will be for the new council to formally adopt or reject the final document.

The fact that in April 2023 we were on the verge of completing the process and writing the final document is testimony to the tenacity and commitment of councillors and officers.

I hope that, if it is formally adopted, it will provide guidance on where the Council can best focus its efforts – for the benefit of the people of Deal.

**Carbon Footprint** Deal Town Council continues to give attention to the matter of reducing the Council's carbon footprint. Efforts remain focussed on the Town Hall, where measures to reduce heat loss and increase the efficiency of our heating systems are proving effective.

The Council has also incentivised water collection and storage measures on the Council's allotments. It is part of an initiative to encourage people to play their part in addressing some of the issues raised by the climate emergency.

We continue to get favourable reviews from our STEM consultant, as reported at the Annual Town Meeting.

**Warm Places** Council expressed its concerns in the Autumn of 2022 about the cost of living crisis and the increases in heating costs. In concert with local churches, charities, and other organisations, Deal Warm Welcome was developed.

The Council provided funds to support the costs of longer opening times at various venues.

I visited some of the sites, and was very impressed by the services provided. As well as a warm place and a warm meal, the scheme provided a place for a chat and companionship. We should never forget the debilitating impact of loneliness which effects far more people than we are aware of.



**Local elections 2023** 4<sup>th</sup> May 2023 is local election day, and a new council will convene soon after. I am sure there will be plenty to keep them busy for the next four years.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank my fellow councillors for their commitment to the town, and at the same time add my thanks to all the officers in the Town Hall for their work in translating ideas and proposals from councillors into practicable outcomes.

### Message from the Town Clerk

As we looked ahead to the summer of 2022, it was with an air of celebration.


Work had already begun to improve our planters across the town with native flowers, shrubs and bushes. At the heart of the planting scheme were seven multi-stem silver birches along the High Street, one for each decade of the Queen's reign.

June marked Her Majesty's 70<sup>th</sup> year of service and the town was decorated in red, white and blue in honour of the Queen. We helped fund the decorations that were organized by the Chamber of Trade and we also dressed the Town Hall. At our Saturday market we handed out free crowns to all our visitors during the extended Bank Holiday weekend to help them join in the celebrations.

However, just a few months later, it was with great sadness that we mourned the passing of our monarch, Queen Elizabeth II, in September. Ceremonies were held across the town, across the country and across the world.

A Book of Condolence was opened at the Town Hall and hundreds of people came and paid

Crowds gathered at Deal Pier and those present were addressed by the Town Mayor, Cllr Chris Turner, a reading was given by Revd. Chris Spencer and The Landmark Choir performed Jerusalem and the National Anthem.

Autumn began with the national Great Big Green Week, and here in Deal we held a host of events to encourage people to act and help the environment.

In October we launched our Green Grants – a new funding stream that allowed people to apply for a cash boost if they were considering schemes that were beneficial to nature or helped raise awareness of climate change. Many groups took up the opportunity and when funds were allocated in the spring, projects including Deal Repair Café were able to be established.

As we approached the winter, fears grew about the cost of living crisis and how people would manage during the colder months to heat their homes and afford food for themselves and or their families.

In response to the situation, the Town Council established Deal Warm Welcome. It was a project that brought together venues and organisations across the town who were able to open their doors, six days a week and offer warmth, friendship and a cup of something hot to drink and a bite to eat. More than 2,000 guests were welcomed across the five months that the project ran. It is hoped that its success will lead a second Deal Warm Welcome the following winter.
