Julia was well liked and highly respected by her colleagues and members of the public and we are all devastated by what has happened. She will be fondly remembered and missed by all —my thoughts go out to Julia’s family and friends and to each and every one of you within the community at this difficult time. One of the biggest policing teams I have known, including some of the very best detectives in the land, are working tirelessly, leaving no stone unturned, to bring the offender to justice. Working with our partners, the safety of our communities remains our priority and we urge anyone who has concerns to speak with our officers who are out and about in the local community, or contact us.



Investigation Update

- A murder investigation is being led by Assistant Chief Constable Tom Richards from Kent Police and Essex Police Serious Crime Directorate.
- Julia’s body was discovered shortly after 4pm on Tuesday 27 April.
- No arrest has been made; we are not ruling anything out and are open to all possibilities.
- Kent Police appeal for people to report anything suspicious or strange they may have witnessed.

Appeal/Contact

It is vitally important that anyone who was in the area on Monday 26 and Tuesday 27 April who may have seen something suspicious get in touch.

We are particularly keen to speak to those who regularly visit the area who may have seen something out of place and those who drove by who have dashcam footage.

Remember to keep your phone on you and charged, plan your route and tell someone where you are going and how long you will be.

Officers will remain at the scene carrying out enquiries over the weekend and through next week.

There will be a significant uniformed police presence in the area and surrounding villages - speak to them, help us to understand how the community is feeling and what else we can do to provide more reassurance.
