### **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest (DPI)**

Where a Member has a new or registered DPI in a matter under consideration, they must disclose that they have an interest and, unless the Monitoring Officer has agreed in advance that the DPI is a 'Sensitive Interest', explain the nature of that interest at the meeting. The Member must withdraw from the meeting at the commencement of the consideration of any matter in which they have declared a DPI and must not participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter unless they have been granted a dispensation permitting them to do so. If during the consideration of any item a Member becomes aware that they have a DPI in the matter they should declare the interest immediately and, subject to any dispensation, withdraw from the meeting.

#### Other Significant Interest (OSI)

Where a Member is declaring an OSI they must also disclose the interest and explain the nature of the interest at the meeting. The Member must withdraw from the meeting at the commencement of the consideration of any matter in which they have declared a OSI and must not participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter unless they have been granted a dispensation to do so or the meeting is one at which members of the public are permitted to speak for the purpose of making representations, answering questions or giving evidence relating to the matter. In the latter case, the Member may only participate on the same basis as a member of the public and cannot participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter and must withdraw from the meeting in accordance with the Council's procedure rules.

#### **Voluntary Announcement of Other Interests (VAOI)**

Where a Member does not have either a DPI or OSI but is of the opinion that for transparency reasons alone s/he should make an announcement in respect of a matter under consideration, they can make a VAOI. A Member declaring a VAOI may still remain at the meeting and vote on the matter under consideration.

#### Note to the Code:

Situations in which a Member may wish to make a VAOI include membership of outside bodies that have made representations on agenda items; where a Member knows a person involved but does not have a close association with that person; or where an item would affect the well-being of a Member, relative, close associate, employer, etc. but not his/her financial position. It should be emphasised that an effect on the financial position of a Member, relative, close associate, employer, etc. OR an application made by a Member, relative, close associate, employer, etc. would both probably constitute either an OSI or in some cases a DPI.

**SUBJECT:** Committee Carbon Emission check list – review

DATE: 10 September 2024

In March 2023, Full Council agreed to adopt the Committee Carbon Emission check list (wheel). Following the election all Councillors were invited to contact the Climate Change Officer for training regarding the checklist if they required it.

The Committee Carbon Emission check list was prepared in consultation with all councillors, Committee Clerk, R.F.O and Town Clerk, and is used in all committees, excluding planning which follows separate guidelines.

It shows the environmental impact of our decisions and has been a clear and effective representation of our climate action ambitions.

This check list assisted in highlighting the environmental impact before Council made their decisions, illustrating climate change has been taken into consideration every step of the way building best practice to ensure everything is viewed through the prism of climate action.

A review of the Carbon Emission Check List was reported to the Environment Committee meeting in August, where Members RESOLVED: To propose to Full Council that we continue with the Carbon Emission Check List on the same basis, and to review this again in Autumn 2025.

Re: Holocaust Memorial Day 2025 – For a Better Future

Holocaust Memorial Day will be held on Monday 27 January 2025 and marks the 80th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi concentration camp complex, and the 30th anniversary of the genocide in Bosnia.

The Holocaust Memorial Day Trust advise that today, in light of events around the world, many communities here in the UK are feeling vulnerable, with hostility and suspicion of others rising.

The theme for Holocaust Memorial Day 2025 is "For a Better Future" and it would be fitting to host a larger event, to mark this special 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary to give our local community the opportunity to come together to learn both from and about the past.

As previously agreed by council the annual Deal Town Council's Holocaust Memorial Day commemoration will be held as usual at the Memorial Stone at St George's church on Monday 27 January 2025. It was also agreed to put on larger events on significant anniversaries, such as this one.

The three noticeboards in the Undercroft will host an exhibition based on resources supplied by the Holocaust Memorial Day trust to show why the date is marked and what it represents.

In the evening, we will host a candlelight reception and invite a guest speaker from our Town of Sanctuary partner, the Kent Refugee Action Network. The CEO Dr Razia Shariff, will join us to speak on "Things need to be different now" to inspire and explain how we can change the conversation and create a better future with our words and actions today.

Holding the evening by candlelight gives an intentional and symbolic message that we are shining light in the dark "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." *The Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.* 

It will also complement the Holocaust Memorial Day community action, 80 Candles for 80 Years #80 Candles. Those attending the event will be gifted with a candle to take home so they too can shine light in the darkness.

Council has allocated £200 for the Holocaust Memorial Day 2025 and the events outlined above sit within that budget. The day of activities strengthens our Town of Sanctuary ambitions.

SUBJECT: Civility and Respect Pledge

The Civility and Respect Pledge has been introduced by the National Association of Local Councils (NALC), Society of Local Council Clerks (SLCC) and One Voice Wales (OVW).

They advise that throughout this sector, there are growing concerns about the impact bullying, harassment, and intimidation are having on local (parish and town) councils, councillors, clerks and council staff and the resulting effectiveness of local councils.

NALC, SLCC, and OVW believe now is the time to put civility and respect at the top of the agenda and start a culture change for the local council sector.

#### **Their Mission Statement**

Civility and respect should be at the heart of public life, and good governance is fundamental to ensuring an effective and well-functioning democracy at all levels.

The intimidation, abuse, bullying and harassment of councillors, clerks and council staff, in person or online, is unacceptable, whether by councillors, clerks, council staff, or public members.

This can prevent councils from functioning effectively, councillors from representing local people, discourage people from getting involved, including standing for election, and undermine public confidence and trust in local democracy.

NALC, county associations and OVW, as the membership organisations representing the first tier of local government in England and Wales, and the SLCC, as the professional body for clerks, are committed to working together to promote civility and respect in public life, good governance, positive debate and supporting the well-being of councillors, professional officers and staff.

To that end, the Civility and Respect Working Group will be working to deliver tangible resources, actions and interventions in four main areas: providing councils with the tools to support good governance; lobbying to strengthen the standards regime and encouraging more people to get involved; training; and processes to intervene to provide support to struggling councils.

#### **Definition of Civility and Respect**

Civility means politeness and courtesy in behaviour, speech, and in the written word.

Examples of ways in which you can show respect are by listening and paying attention to others, having consideration for other people's feelings, following protocols and rules, showing appreciation and thanks, and being kind.

By the council signing up to the Civility and Respect pledge it will demonstrate that the council is committed to treating councillors, clerks, employees, members of the public, representatives of partner organisations, and volunteers, with civility and respect in their role.

Signing up should be a simple process, it requires councils to register online and agree to the following statements (I have added a supporting evidence box to assist councillors with the information). Once we complete the online process the council will receive a certificate by email and we will be listed alongside others on a national map, showing the councils that have signed up.

As the councils outside body representative for Deal Music and Arts Limited, I have the following information. There is also a Learning and Participation Report that can be found on this link A24-0744-DMA-LP-Report-2024.pdf (dealmusicandarts.com)



The 2024 Deal Festival was the biggest Deal Festival that has ever been mounted, with over 65 events spanning all art forms, encompassing new commissions, artists of the highest calibre and a central focus on the community that makes Deal such a fantastic place to live and visit. This created a wonderful buzz and hive of activity in the town and created a range of choice in the festival which has opened the organisation to all audiences and communities in our local area and further afield.

The 2024 festival theme was French Connections, and this was explored through a host of French music from the Renaissance to today. We welcomed four French artists from Paris who delivered a series of four concerts that covered a huge diversity of repertoire from church music to cabaret and allowed our audience to get to know these four artists in performance and in conversations after concerts. This initiative was part of the 120 Entente Cordiale celebrations and promoted in collaboration with the Institut Français.

O f 🛚 🖭 The festival featured a 3-part film series exploring classic new wave French cinema and Jessica Walker performed a unique deep dive into the extraordinary life and works of Barbara, one of the greatest French singersongwriters of the twentieth century.



2024 was a year of big "firsts" with our inaugural Composer in Residence (Florence Anna Maunders) and Young Artist in Association in collaboration with the Royal Academy of Music (Lizzie Knatt). These two artists were involved across the whole festival in multiple events (as well as before and

after the festival in our Spring Concert series and our Summer School), which gave our audience a chance to get to know them and their music. It also gave the two artists a chance to try out different creative ideas of their own, to gain curatorial experience and to write new works specifically for the festival. This involved two new commissions from Florence, one for our Community Band, giving Florence valuable experience in writing for amateur musicians, and one for professional chamber orchestra, Chamber Domaine, which will be repeated at the Wigmore Hall in 2025, building a legacy for DMA and Florence.

Our second Poetry Day was a huge success. We built on 2023 by offering a series of development sessions for young poets and musicians (mentored by Jacob Sam-La Rose and Luke Styles) to create bespoke events of music and poetry for our audience. This gave valuable cross arts collaborative experiences to these artists and created original poetry/music events for our audience. These were accompanied by poetry readings and an open mic night which brought together the flourishing local poetry scene in Deal. Our literature strand was in full swing again this year with the



likes of Tom Service, Gavin Esler and Alison Weir captivating the audience with personal insights into their work, politics in Britain and the musical culture of France. Local writers Deborah Moggach and Lord Gawain Douglas displayed the wealth of literary talent that exists in Deal.

For the second year in a row local musicians filled the streets of Deal with our Town Takeover letting everyone know that there was a festival happening and kicking off the festival buzz on the festival's opening weekend. This was continued into our Afterwork Tunes events where community bands had a chance to entertain audiences with a drink at local music pub the Walmer Castle. In total this gave a chance for 100 local musicians to take part in the festival.

Festival 2024 brought together for the first time two of the town's most prestigious local music making bodies, the Betteshanger Colliery Welfare Band and The Deal and Walmer Handelian Choral Society. These two groups collaborated on a joint programme performed at the Betteshanger Sports and Social Club, an important local establishment that the festival worked with for the first time in 2024. This event was packed, it was a real celebration of all of Deal's communities, at a local social venue, playing joyous music at a high level.

Young People were at the centre of the 2024 festival with a bespoke programme of events for young people and families of all ages. The centrepiece of this programme was Circo Rum Ba Ba's The Whale, a giant inflatable whale with a theatre show inside. This made a striking impression in the town, drawing attention to the festival and exciting the young people who were entertained and it also exposed them to important environmental issues facing our coastal community. We hosted a dance workshop and performance based on the children's book The Koala Who Could, family friendly concerts of classical music and events by local early years practitioner



Sarah Hubbard with her Moo Music interactive sessions. We also worked with the Chineke! Orchestra and Dover secondary school students on new compositions that were showcased in a lunchtime concert with Chineke! playing alongside the Dover students.

In addition to our Young Artist in Association we continued to promote the early careers of young professionals. From the Keyboard Trust we were treated to a virtuosic recital from Gabrielė Sutkutė,

and sold-out lunchtime concerts from the likes of RPS Awards-nominated and Countess of Munster Musical Trust accordionist Ryan Corbett and award-winning guitarist Jack Hancher. There were workshops for all ages from kora player Kadiale Kouyate and tabla player Kuljit Bhamra.

The festival featured the results of an amazing collaboration between the Irene Taylor Trust (ITT) and our own Community Band. This involved ITT workshop leaders spending many weeks working with local young people in Kent at risk of offending writing their own songs, as well as with former prisoners from Kent. These two groups then came together to perform their new music with our Community Band including a new piece from our Composer in Residence. The multiple strands to this project were incredibly moving and uplifting for audiences and participants alike.

Jazz, popular music and global music were more on offer in 2024 than ever before with a new collaboration with the Smugglers Festival which brought together audiences young and old dancing in the aisles of St George's Church. There they enjoyed Gamelan Lila Cita and Baque Luar an allfemale Brazilian vocal and drumming group. One of the UK's most exciting young jazz musicians Sultan Stevenson played a soldout gig at local venue The Lighthouse. The National Youth Jazz Orchestra combined with our own DMA Jazz Academy to perform a concert of Latin music. We featured two Kent-based experiential rock and ambient bands in late-night gigs, as well as the hugely popular Jeremy Sassoon singing jazz, blues, groove and soul classics from the 20th and 21st centuries.



It was a breakthrough year for opera at the Deal Festival with the critically acclaimed Wild Arts opera company performing a stunning fully staged production of the Magic Flute at St. Mary's Arts Centre in Sandwich. This was an important chance for local audiences to hear high quality opera without having to travel to London or Glyndebourne, and at a fraction of the price. Theatre was also able to

be enjoyed once again from Kent company the Changeling Theatre, whose Henry V was a festival highlight. More experimental theatre was on offer in the form of Dracula Bite Size featuring narrator Jon Iles (from ITV's The Bill) and clarinettist and composer of the show's music Sarah Watts.

The festival continued to champion living composers and to celebrate diversity across all our events, whether this was in the form of performers or composers from diverse backgrounds or artists who are underrepresented because of their gender or sexual orientation.

The Deal Festival is proving to be a welcoming place to celebrate every facet of our society through the arts. Our commitment to new music was particularly in evidence with music by living composers in every single concert. We were exceptionally proud of our inaugural Composer in Residence Florence Anna Maunders and our two festival commissions, from Florence and from Aaron Holloway-Nahum. Both pieces were part of our biggest concert(s), a two-part journey through all of Bach's Brandenburg Concertos alongside nine new commissions (3 of which were world premieres). These two concerts were introduced by writer, critic and journalist Sir Nicholas Kenyon and hosted by





BBC Radio 3 journalist Tom Service. These two concerts typified the world class calibre of Deal Festival events and our position at the forefront of new music and in the celebration of music of the past.

**SUBJECT:** Outside body report on Cliffs of Sanctuary (CoS)

As a Linked Councillor, I attended the CoS Planning Meeting held on 9th September.

- I remain slightly unclear about how the three organisations operating in this area interlink/overlap etc – vis DARA, Samphire and CoS. Certainly the role being taken by Sanctuary in working with schools precludes CoS forging links with children and young people up to a point.
- Our council's pledge to become a *Town of Sanctuary* is being considered imminently.
   Walmer and Dover are on a similar trajectory and the Trustees (see below) hope to engage DDC also. Over 150 councils around the country have already pledged their support.
- Our local "branch" is doing well with 6 trustees, 28 individuals having pledged and a range of other volunteers offering active support. If the owner of the Walmer Sea Cafe is actively engaged, the trustees hope that this venue can be used as a place to meet.
- The complexity of the target group was evident, with most of those willing and able to
  offer help and support living in Deal and those with most need residing in Dover plus the
  different legal status of certain ethnic groups (Afghans, Syrians and Ukrainians and their
  differing needs as well as those who come to the UK as refugees on boats etc).
- My sense was of our Council's support being much appreciated but the greatest anxiety being the mismatch between what could be offered by way of support and the capacity of those actively engaged; the emphasis throughout the discussion was on what was a realistic aspiration in their planning.

The organiser has already drafted her own notes of the meeting for CoS members as follows and is content for it to be shared:

Notes from Cliffs of Sanctuary Activity Review and Planning Meeting 9 Sep 24

**Present:** Tricia Grist, Khalid Waziri, Les Craggs, Christine Oliver, Stuart Ponder, Jan Ponder, Duane Poppe, Joy Stephens, Alex Ntung

**Apologies :** Ritika Gurung, Paul Claydon, Floortje Hoette, Angie Buser, Peter St Ange, Maya Ramsay, Shorsh Saleh

The meeting was structured around the 4 components in which Cliffs have engaged in its first 8 months:

- 1. **LGAs:** Getting local councils on board as towns of sanctuary. Dover, Walmer and Deal are all on the path. This is a critical stream because of the resources that local councils can provide for other streams. We agreed that encouragement of this process needs to continue as a priority give the councils critical future role in supporting other streams.
- 2. **Movement building:** Our initial Information Evening in February was well appreciated and did encourage the LGAs and other organisations and individuals attending to consider joining. No real concrete progress other than the LGAs, mainly because of lack of capacity to follow up opportunities with other participants.
- 3. Friendship and support: those members of Cliffs engaged in individual friendship and support activities testified to the positive impact and cultural learning for themselves, as well as for recent migrants with whom they engaged. We agreed that pushing forward on this is the best way to build up individual volunteer commitment and capacity for the movement. We felt that organizing small scale get togethers around fun activities maybe in our homes is the best way forward to develop friendships and encourage volunteers into independent friendship relations.
- **4. Awareness/Lobbying events:** Womens' Day and Refugee Week were successful in brings new migrants together with the host community, but required a lot of energy and resources for organizing. We noted that the "conversations with refugees" event during Refugee Week was the reason why some people have engaged as volunteers in the movement.

**Special Note:** During discussion we learned about an initiative originating with the Afghan community in Dover, namely an event to express their gratitude to the DART (council) team of support workers – will include a powerpoint presentation on Afghan culture/history. We wholeheartedly endorse this initiative, and offer our support if needed, but wish the lead in organising to stay with them.

## **Priorities and Action Plan for the 6-12 months**

Given our limited volunteer base and organizational capacity, we need to concentrate on activities that will bring more volunteers into the movement. We also agreed that the critical engagement with the councils must continue.

- Small scale get-togethers (top priority): Christine volunteered to organize a get-together sometime in December, and Joy and Duane are willing to host one (time TBA). Khalid volunteered to identify participants from the Afghan migrant community, and Stuart the same among his friends in the Deal host community.
- **Encouraging LGAs:** Joy will take lead on liaison and support to the three current towns of sanctuary candidates. She will also initiate contacts with Dover District Council councillors who can get a supporting motion through the DDC.
- **Conversations with Refugees:** We want to host another 'Refugee Conversation' not necessarily restricted to Refugee Week. Mention was made of organising in partnership with an existing community or faith group who might be interested to host such an event. We are seeking a volunteer to take the lead in pursuing this.

To facilitate future cooperation, Christine will set up a Whatsapp group. Those willing to sign up should notify Joy their numbers.
