### **Declarations of Interest**

### Disclosable Pecuniary Interest (DPI)

Where a Member has a new or registered DPI in a matter under consideration they must disclose that they have an interest and, unless the Monitoring Officer has agreed in advance that the DPI is a 'Sensitive Interest', explain the nature of that interest at the meeting. The Member must withdraw from the meeting at the commencement of the consideration of any matter in which they have declared a DPI and must not participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter unless they have been granted a dispensation permitting them to do so. If during the consideration of any item a Member becomes aware that they have a DPI in the matter they should declare the interest immediately and, subject to any dispensations, withdraw from the meeting.

### Other Significant Interest (OSI)

Where a Member is declaring an OSI they must also disclose the interest and explain the nature of the interest at the meeting. The Member must withdraw from the meeting at the commencement of the consideration of any matter in which they have declared a OSI and must not participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter unless they have been granted a dispensation to do so or the meeting is one at which members of the public are permitted to speak for the purpose of making representations, answering questions or giving evidence relating to the matter. In the latter case, the Member may only participate on the same basis as a member of the public and cannot participate in any discussion of, or vote taken on, the matter and must withdraw from the meeting in accordance with the Council's procedure rules.

### **Voluntary Announcement of Other Interests (VAOI)**

Where a Member does not have either a DPI or OSI but is of the opinion that for transparency reasons alone s/he should make an announcement in respect of a matter under consideration, they can make a VAOI. A Member declaring a VAOI may still remain at the meeting and vote on the matter under consideration.

### Note to the Code:

Situations in which a Member may wish to make a VAOI include membership of outside bodies that have made representations on agenda items; where a Member knows a person involved, but does not have a close association with that person; or where an item would affect the well-being of a Member, relative, close associate, employer, etc. but not his/her financial position. It should be emphasised that an effect on the financial position of a Member, relative, close associate, employer, etc OR an application made by a Member, relative, close associate, employer, etc would both probably constitute either an OSI or in some cases a DPI.


Subject: Correspondence received: Traffic Concerns - London Rd & Claremont Rd, Deal

The Committee Clerk has received the following correspondence from a resident.

I am writing to raise two important issues affecting our community in Deal.

Firstly, I am concerned about the traffic conditions along London Road. There have been several accidents along this stretch of road, including fatalities, which do not appear to be adequately recorded. Residents share my apprehension when walking along London Road due to the excessive speed's vehicles can reach on this straight road, exacerbated by the narrow footpaths. My review of the Crash Map website suggests that the data may not be current or comprehensive enough to capture these incidents effectively (<a href="http://www.crashmap.co.uk/">http://www.crashmap.co.uk/</a>).

Additionally, I have learned of incidents where residents on Claremont Road have had accidents while attempting to turn onto London Road, owing to restricted visibility caused by high hedges and parked cars on the corner, compounded by speeding traffic. I urge the local council to assess this road and develop a plan to mitigate risks and reduce traffic speed. Attached is a screenshot highlighting the section of concern.



### Recommendation:

- 1. Chairperson in liaison with the Committee Clerk writes to KCC Highways regarding the number of incidents on London Road caused by speeding and ask for confirmation that these are being captured effectively.
- 2. Delegate authority to the Committee Clerk to report the restricted visibility issue caused by high hedges on the corner of Claremont Road with KCC.
- 3. Committee consider adding London Road to our 3<sup>rd</sup> HIP application for traffic calming measures.

The Committee Clerk has received correspondence from a resident

I wish to address the issue of parking by customers of the Middle Street Coffee shop. There appears to be a growing trend where patrons, particularly during busy morning hours, park illegally on the main street over double yellow lines to visit the coffee shop. This not only obstructs traffic flow in both directions but also complicates merging off the roundabout. Furthermore, I have observed these customers congregating outside their vehicles, further obstructing the road, and compromising their safety. This normally is at its worst from 8:30 to 9:30 in the morning.



I raise these concerns not to complain but out of genuine concern for our community's safety and well-being. Having lived in Deal for over a decade, I base my observations on a thorough understanding of our local area.

I have copied Mike Tapp, presuming he secures the next seat in Deal, Dover.

**Recommendation:** Chairperson in liaison with the Committee Clerk writes to DDC Parking Services regarding vehicles parking on the double yellow lines along Broad Street.

Subject: Highways Improvement Plan 2<sup>nd</sup> Application Update

The Highways Improvement Plan (HIP) is the agreed method to advise Kent County Council of any highways related projects that Deal Town Council would like the KCC East Highways Improvement Team to consider.

At the May T&I Committee this was discussed, and members RESOLVED:

- 1. Not to add any further suggestions to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Highways Improvement Plan application.
- 2. To amend the priority order of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Highways Improvement Plan by moving number 6. Duke Street/High Street and 7. Milldale Close (off Mill Road) to the top of the HIP report.
- 3. Committee Clerk to bring back DTC's 3<sup>rd</sup> HIP application for Committee suggestions to the November Meeting.

The Deputy Town Clerk and Committee Clerk had a meeting with the KCC EHI Team regarding our 2<sup>nd</sup> HIP application on the 30<sup>th</sup> May on Teams. The 7 items on our application were discussed in detail for viability and feasibility.

KCC recommended a change to the priority order of our HIP by moving **Duke Street and Milldale Close** damaged dropped kerbs to numbers 6 and 7 respectively. The EHI Officer advised the
Committee Clerk to report these on the KCC website, this has been actioned by the Committee Clerk
and reference numbers 815001 and 815039 have been received from KCC. The KCC EHI Officer will
support this enquiry if they are not progressed.

KCC advised that on the HIP items for **Hamilton Rd/Junction by Co-op, St Richards Rd & Mill Hill/Manor Rd Junction** they will liaise with their Planning and Advice Team to establish the best/safest position for a dropped kerb crossing point.

In relation to **Sondes Rd/Seafront crossing**, the EHI Officer stated that there were two possible options that they will put to the Planning and Advice Team:

- 1) The already installed dropped kerb on seafront opposite The Regent be lowered (tactile cannot be installed here).
- 2) Liaise with Planning & Advice Team that a dropped kerb with tactile paving be installed in the safest vicinity.

With regards to **Rectory Road/Upper Deal Roundabout**, KCC advised that due to the solid structures obscuring the junctions, it would not be possible to make further improvements here. A STOP Sign rather than Give Way has been implemented along with a roundabout. LC to provide HADMS data to show low speeds of each approaching arm.

Following this discussion DTC's 2<sup>nd</sup> HIP application was submitted to KCC and the EHI Officer advised that our application has been accepted. (see HIP attached).

This HIP is fixed until next year when the 3rd iteration will be considered.

The Committee Clerk will bring DTC's 3<sup>rd</sup> HIP application back to the November T&I Committee for suggestions from committee members.

### **Best Foot Forward Project Update**

The Best Foot Forward project runs from Earth Day in March until Cycle September – as it stands today, we will have pledged to remove more than 120 kilos of CO2e emissions or 483 miles.

On social media, Best Foot Forward has so far reached 2,184 people and received 2,501 impressions and residents have signed up to pledge and swap at least one mile car journey once a week and walking or cycling instead.

It has featured in the Community Ad magazine that goes to every home in Deal <u>BFF page 24</u> and has been issued as news release and on our website (and received more than 250 page visits.)

We're halfway through Best Foot Forward and collectively we have pledged more than 480 miles – that's the equivalent of a journey to Paris...and back!

A draw has taken place every month since April, and residents who have pledged have had the chance to win free e-bike hire and will continue until September.

### Kent County Council - Pothole Blitz

From Sevenoaks to Margate, Sheerness to Dymchurch, Kent County Council (KCC) highways crews are on it - come rain or shine - fixing potholes for the Pothole Blitz programme.

Following the announcement in March 2024 that KCC received additional funding of £8.6 million from the Department for Transport (DfT), crews have been out repairing medium to large-scale defects on the county's roads, helping to keep Kent moving.

With over 18,000 reported potholes across the county last year, this is a significant task to tackle. Highways teams have been identifying and planning the works, ensuring they are fully coordinated across the county and spread equally over several months to minimise disruption and impact to road users.

Since March, nearly 3000 potholes have been repaired through the Pothole Blitz programme, with an additional 2000 repaired through other KCC's own road and footway planned maintenance budget.

Residents will expect to see more crews out on the road for the programme, please treat them with respect as they make improvements to the highway.

There are currently repairs ongoing in Deal at Cowdray Square, Church Path and Pilots Avenue. The resurfacing work scheduled for July in Northwall Road being moved until the end of August. This will be in three phases of closure, over three weekends from 9am to 4pm, beginning on Saturday 31 August.
